

PEDESTRIANS KNOW YOUR LEGAL RIGHTS!



· Summary of Oregon Laws ·



Shoulders and Sidewalks

- Pedestrians must walk upon a usable sidewalk or shoulder adjacent to the roadway if available rather than on a roadway. ORS 814.070(1)(a)
- Motorists may not park on sidewalks, within 20 feet of crosswalks, within 50 feet of traffic control devices if view is obstructed, or on bike lanes or paths. ORS 811.550
- Motorists must stop when emerging from an alley, driveway or building before crossing a sidewalk. ORS 811.505
- A pedestrian MAY NOT suddenly leave a curb or other place of safety and move into a path of a vehicle so close as to constitute an immediate hazard. ORS 814.040



Crosswalk Laws

- Pedestrians have right of way on sidewalks and on marked AND UNMARKED crosswalks. ORS 811.025, 811.028
- EVERY CORNER IS A CROSSWALK, ORS 801.220
- Vehicles must stop and remain stopped for pedestrians in crosswalks in BOTH the lane of travel AND the adjacent lane, except at intersections with a traffic control device, vehicles must stop and remain stopped for pedestrians in the lane of travel plus six feet on either side. ORS 811.028
- As soon as a pedestrian steps onto a safety island, all vehicles on the side of the road where the pedestrian is headed must stop and remain stopped. ORS 811.028(3)(a)
- · Vehicles may not pass a vehicle stopped for a pedestrian in a crosswalk. ORS 811.020
- Pedestrians in roadways outside crosswalks must yield to all vehicles (which includes bicycles) on the roadway. ORS 814.040(b)



Roads and Highways

- If there is no usable sidewalk, pedestrians may walk upon the highway shoulder facing traffic (or on the right side of a divided highway) as far as practical from the roadway edge. ORS 814.070
- If there is no usable sidewalk or shoulder, pedestrians may walk facing traffic on the outside edge of the roadway. ORS 814.070



Insurance

 All Oregon car insurance covers pedestrians in collisions with cars even if the motorist involved in the collision is uninsured. "PIP" ORS 742.520



Shoulders and Sidewalks

 Bicyclists must provide an AUDIBLE WARNING when passing a pedestrian on a sidewalk or mixed use path. ORS 814.410
